Colleagues,

Since the pandemic brought about by COVID-19 there have been many proclamations regarding when, who, where and how to treat dental patients. The ADA guidelines encompass the most realistic approach dividing patients into emergent and urgent care categories. The Pennsylvania Department of Health (PDOH) has mandated certain restrictions on the dental community in regard to PPE and facility constraint. Our office is now in compliance with the PDOH, as it stands today, to render care as outlined by the ADA. Our office is equipped with two state-of-the-art negative pressure rooms. We will work with our dental community to care for the emergent and urgent cases. We are relying on you to refer patients for consultation who meet the ADA criteria. Treatment will be rendered on a case-by-case basis.

If you are requesting to utilize our facility, the following is requested:

- Copy of current dental license.
- Copy of professional liability insurance which will require a phone call to your carrier to alert them of your intent to of practice at our location.
- One Dental Assistant
- Please bring your own supplies and equipment. We will provide; the room, N95 mask, face shield, and gown. (We will assist with other supplies and equipment as necessary)
- The patient must be an established patient of the treating dentist
- All cases should be reviewed with Dr. Hecht prior to scheduling with our scheduling coordinators.

If you are sending a patient to us, we are requesting that Dr. Hecht speak to the referring dentist in order to determine criteria for treatment.
